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## Observations and Corrective Actions

Violations cited in this report must be corrected within the time frames below, or as stated in sections 8-405.11 and 8-406.11 of the Food Code

14: 4-501.114.(A).(1): C: Dishes/utensils are not being sanitized in water with the correct chlorine sanitizer concentration.

INSPECTOR NOTES: no sanitizer in buckets corrected on site

37: 3-307.11: N: Food not protected from other sources of contamination.

INSPECTOR NOTES: freezer fish uncovered corrected on site

39: 3-304.14.(B).(1): N: Wiping cloths used for wiping counters and other equipment surfaces not held between uses in a chemical sanitizer.

INSPECTOR NOTES: wet cloths on counter corrected on site

45: 4-204.16: N: Beverage tubing and/or cold plate improperly installed in contact with stored ice.

INSPECTOR NOTES: ice for drinks cannot be in contact with beverage tubing cold plate

45: 4-501.12: N: Cutting surfaces not easily cleanable.

INSPECTOR NOTES: replace 2 cutting boards

47: 4-602.13: N: Non-food contact surfaces are not cleaned at a frequency necessary to preclude accumulation of soil residues.

INSPECTOR NOTES: clean exterior of storage containers(pickel buckets-clean door seals refrigeration units

53: 6-201.11: N: Floors, walls, and ceilings are not smooth and easily cleanable.

INSPECTOR NOTES: replace water stained ceiling tiles--re-seal flooring back of cooking area

53: 6-201.16: N: Wall and ceiling coverings are not easily cleanable.

INSPECTOR NOTES: repair walls storage room area

53: 6-501.12: N: The physical facilities are not clean.

INSPECTOR NOTES: clean in back of all equipment throughout facility-clean top of light fixture serving area dining room

53: 6-501.16: N: Mops are not being properly stored.

INSPECTOR NOTES: mop stored wet in bucket-please hand to dry-clean mop sink

### 2013 Maine Food Code Adoption

The Maine Food Code was adopted in October of 2013. Please refer to our website for a copy, <http://www.maine.gov/healthinspection>. Following are a few of the major changes:

- " No Bare Hand Contact with Ready-To-Eat Food. Handlers are required to use gloves, utensils, deli papers, etc., to avoid bare hand contact with ready-to-eat food;
- " Establishments must have clean-up procedures for employees to follow following vomiting and diarrheal events;
- " Responsibilities of the person in charge for ill employees (exclusions and restrictions); and,
- " Date marking of Ready-to-eat potentially hazardous foods.

### Violation Correction Timeframe

Critical violations should be corrected on site, but in any event, within 10 days. The licensee must contact the inspector when the critical violation has been addressed at 207-( 513-3125 Ext 3224 ) or email ( [sreny@lewistonmaine.gov](mailto:sreny@lewistonmaine.gov) ). Non-critical violations must be corrected within 30 days. Failure to satisfactorily correct these violations before the follow-up inspection may result in enforcement proceedings by the Department to include fines and penalties, which are outlined in Sections 7, 8 and 9 of the Rules Relating to the Administration and Enforcement of Establishments Licensed by the Health Inspection Program available at <http://www.maine.gov/healthinspection>. License renewals can be denied if violations are not corrected within the noted timeframes.

C= Critical violation and NC= Non-critical violation

"Critical violation" means a provision of the Food Code that, if in non-compliance, is more likely than other violations to contribute to food contamination, illness or environmental health hazard.

### Additional Inspection Fee

License fees provide for two inspections per year. When additional inspections are required, the Department may charge an additional \$100 fee to cover the costs of each additional inspection or visit.

### Document Retention/Posting

Pursuant to the Maine Food Code, the establishment's current license must be displayed. In addition, a sign or placard must be posted in a conspicuous area notifying consumers that a copy of the most recent inspection report is available upon request. CFPM certificates must be posted in a conspicuous area and must be available to the Department upon request.
